The SAVE (Safeguard American Voter Eligibility) Act – Pennsylvania

The Republicans' so-called "SAVE" Act, like Donald Trump's extremist anti-voting executive order, would restrict voting for millions of eligible American citizens and collectively cost them billions.

This bill is a problem in search of solutions. Plain and simple: The SAVE Act is a voter suppression bill meant to trick Americans into thinking it's solely to prevent non-citizens from voting. The SAVE Act is a voter suppression bill that would place a burden on military voters, married women, rural voters, voters of color, and millions of other eligible Americans – all while collectively costing Pennsylvanians millions.

Under the SAVE Act, Pennsylvanians would be unable to register to vote using their driver's license alone. They could instead use:

- A passport.
 - Roughly 53.9 percent of Pennsylvanians do not have passports—at a cost of \$130 per passport, the SAVE Act could force Pennsylvanians to pay over \$876 million just to register to vote.
- A birth certificate with their current legal name.
 - But an estimated 2,860,875 Pennsylvania women have a name that does not match their birth certificate, usually because they changed their name upon marriage. The SAVE Act would prevent many of these women from registering to vote or casting a ballot.
- Military service papers.
 - O Not a military ID alone documented service papers with sensitive information.

Don't be fooled. This is a modern-day Jim Crow bill that restricts access to the ballot box. Put simply – the SAVE Act and Donald Trump's anti-voting executive order, will collectively suppress votes.
